Market Perspective. Tough week, with the DOW down 2.35%; the S&P down 2.65%; and the NAS-DAQ down 3.10%. All three indices are down YTD. Economic news for the week did not seem to be a reason for the drop. Many pundits noted that the declines are concentrated in recent "momentum" stocks and "new tech," as opposed to "old tech." Facebook (FB), Twitter (TWTR,) Tesla (TSLA), Netflix (NFLX), and biotechs and 3D printer stocks have taken it on the chin. Boring is back, as utilities, fixed income, and dividend paying stocks have outperformed the more glamorous names.

We will talk about this and whether it is time to dial back portfolio risk with defensive moves.

Fund Indexes. I will look at the Russell indexes. The Russell 50, 200, 1000, 2000 and 3000. What is the mix of large-cap, mid-cap, and small-cap in these indexes? For most of them, Russell further breaks them down into value and growth indexes, which means that we can compare growth and income stocks for performance.

Stocks of the Week (from the Buy/Sell List.) Coca-Cola (KO.) We know that Warren Buffett likes Coke both as a beverage and an investment, as does one of our members, who says he/she will talk about it. And if you don't like soft drinks, we can also talk about Anheuser Busch (BUD,) the "king of beers," if I recall correctly ads from 50 years ago.

Book Review: "Den of Thieves." This book was first published in 1991, and is about arbitrageur/corporate raider Ivan Boesky, Drexel Burnham and junk bonds, and Michael Milken. I will offer brief observations on the book, and how things have changed since the 1980s when it comes to corporate wrongdoing.
