Market Perspective. A down week, after five straight up weeks. For the week ending March 25, the DOW was down 0.5%; the S&P down 0.7%; and the NASDAQ down 0.5%. Falling oil prices were to blame; the market's correlation to energy prices continues. And perhaps the market just needed a breather after moving up so strongly from the February 11, 2016 lows.

"Solid Dividend Bets." Let's look at ten stocks from this week's <u>Barron's</u> article.

Mid-Cap and Small Cap stocks. We have not looked at mid-caps and small-caps in a while. Let's look at what mid-caps and small-caps are, and how they have performed compared to large-caps, and at what points in the business cycle they do better or worse than the large-caps.
